Establishment of 169 Primary Health Centres in the Non Tribal Areas by upgrading existing ~~Rural~~ Health Institutions during 1983-84.

- ii) Letter No. DDHS/PDE/MNF/PHC/83-84/D-7, dated the 18th May 1983 from the Director of Health Services, Bombay.
- iii) Letter No. DHS/PDE/PH-83-84/D-7/83 dated the 16th September 1983 from the Director of Health Services, Bombay.

RESOLUTION:- As per the guide lines of the Government of India in respect of Minimum Needs Programme, there should be one Primary Health Centre for every rural population of 30,000 in Non-Tribal areas and for every 20,000 population for Tribal and hilly areas. The number of Primary Health Centres that will have, thus, to be established on the basis of 1981 census population comes to 1416 i.e., 1250 in Non-Tribal and 166 in Tribal areas. As against this, there are 477 Primary Health Centres in existence at present leaving a backlog of 939 Primary Health Centres. Out of these it is proposed to establish 169 Primary Health Centres in Non-Tribal areas during 1983-84.

2. The concept, of providing health infrastructure accepted by the Planning Commission envisages a four tier system i.e., Sub-Centre, Primary Health Centre, Rural Hospital, and a District Health Quarter Hospital. It is, thus, necessary to redesignate or convert the existing health institutions other than those mentioned above appropriately. With this view and with a view to making most cost effective use of resources and effective coverage by Primary Health Centres to the rural population, Govt. has decided to upgrade suitable existing ~~suitable~~ Health Institutions into Primary Health Centres.

Government is, therefore, pleased to direct that 85 Primary Health Units, 75 Dispensaries, 8 Subsidiary Health Centres and 1 Maternity Home in the Non-Tribal areas should be upgraded into Primary Health Centres during 1983-84. The districtwise allocation of these upgraded Primary Health Centres is as shown in the statement 'A' appended.

In addition to the above staff 106 existing posts of Class-III Medical Officer should also be upgraded to those of MM & HS Class-II Medical Officer in the pay scale as mentioned against Serial No.1 in the statement above. The upgraded posts should be treated as newly created and temporary addition to the MM & HS Class-II Cadre.

5. The locations and details of 169 individual institutions to be upgraded and staff sanctioned therefore are as given in the Statements I to XXVIII appended to this Resolution.

6. The posts should be created with immediate effect and should be continued upto and inclusive 29th February 1984 in the first instance. The incumbents of the posts will be eligible for usual allowances as admissible under the rules.



7. Sanction is also accorded for purchase of 169 vehicles for 169 upgraded Primary Health Centres at an estimated cost of Rs.80,000/- per vehicle. This sanction is accorded to the recurring expenditure on account of pay and allowances, medicines etc., and non-recurring contingencies on account of purchase of vehicles, additions and alterations, purchase of equipment etc. during the current financial year. Orders about districtwise distribution of budget provisions will issue separately.

8. The expenditure on this account is debitable to "282-Public Health and Water Supply-A-Public Health and Sanitation-(n) Minimum Needs Programme-(n)(ii) Grants for Plan Schemes under section 187 of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act-1961(282 200 4)" Demand No.192 and met from the grants sanctioned thereunder during the current financial year. Orders about districtwise distribution of budget grants will be issued separately as mentioned in para-7 above. The Director of Health Services, Bombay should send necessary proposals in the matter immediately.

9. This Resolution issues with the concurrence of the Planning Department and the Finance Department vide F.D. un-official-reference No.CR 1770/EXP-12 dated the 30th Sept. 1983.
