Grant of permission for brick-making.

## CIRCULAR

It has been brought to the notice of Government of India
that brick-Kilms are cropping up every where using fertile soil, from
the top layers. The Government of India observed that it takes nature
over a century to make one centi-metre of top soil and that neither
the brick-makers nor the house owners who use these bricks have
realisation of this fact when they use valuable top soil for brickmaking. Brick-making should be linked to the creation of permanent
assets such as farm ponds or water-channels through the careful
choice of sites for kilms based on the topography of a given area.

2. It is, therefore, considered necessary that while granting
Licences for brick-making, it should be seen that such Licences are
not granted in the fertile lands which are under cultivation taking
into consideration the above said observations of the Government of
India.
