CIRCULAR OF GOVERNMENT.

As per section 22 of the Maharashtra Land Revenue Code, 1966 powers have been delegated to the Collectors to assign unoccupied Government lands for public purpose such as Kabara--sthan etc. It has been brought to the notice of Government that many a time applications from the Muslim Communities to allow them to construct a compound wall at their own cost around the Kabarasthan area are not dealt with promptly which results in encroaching the same. It is further observed that the delay in such cases is caused because of delay in measurement and fixation of boundaries of such lands through the Land Record Department. In order to avoid delay in future, Government is pleased to direct that on receipt of application for construction of compound wall, the assigned lands for Kabarasthan be measured expeditiously by the Land Records Department and permission to construct the compound wall at their own expenses around the . Kabarasthan be granted within a period of 3 months from the date of receipts of such application. If such applications are not decided within the above period, the permission to construct the compound wall should be deemed to have been granted. After construction of compound wall by the Muslim Community at it'ss own cost, the ownership of the compound wall shall vest in Government/M.C./Village Panchayat as the case may be.

2. All the Collectors are requested to take suitable action in the matter and ensure that the above instructions are followed scrupulously.
