As per Section 133 of the Bombay Village Panchayat Act, 1958, all Village Panchayats in the District are required to contribute towards the District Village Development Fund. According to rule 3 of the Bombay Village Development Fund shall vest in the Standing Committee and shall be administered by it through the District Village Panchayat Officer, i.e. the Administrative Officer, Kolhapur Zilla Parishad, Kolhapur. The Block Development Officers are required to collect the contribution and it is necessary to credit the amounts at the Taluka level. For this purpose it is proposed to open an account in the District Treasury and Sub-treasuries styling it as P.D. Account of Maharashtra District Village Development Fund in the name of the Administrative Officer, / and the District Village Panchayat Officer, Kolhapur. Zilla Parishad, Kolhapur/ I, therefore, request you to move Government to allow, to open this account. Necessary orders, in the matter may kindly be issued as early as possible.

Subject: Manner of obtaining Loan by
Village Panchayat from the
District Development Funds...

Sir,

Rule No.10 of the rules of the Bombay District Development Funds rules 1960, prescribes the manner of obtaining loan by a Village Panchayats desirous of obtaining a loan. Sub-rule 2 of these rules lays down that the application of the loan made under Sub-rule 1 of the said rule shall be supported by ~~a resolution~~ passed by a majority of two third of the members of the Panchayat

[a resolution]

For the purposes of the conduct of the meetings of the Panchayat a set-of rules called the Bombay Village Panchayat (Meetings) rules 1959 has been framed by Government and according to the rule 9 of these rules, the quorum necessary for tranction of business at a meeting of the Panchayat shall be one-half of the total number of members of the Panchayat including the Sarpanch and the Up-Sarpanch and all questions are to be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting at such meetings.

A question has arisen as to whether two thirds of the members present and voting at the meeting of the Panchayat can pass a resolution for applying for a loan from the District Development Fund or whether such a resolution will have to be passed by a 2/3 majority of the total number of the members of the Panchayat.

It is therefore, requested to kindly issue a clarification in the matter, so that such cases can be dealt with accordingly.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter No. ZP-VPT-WS-III-1964, dated the 23rd November 1964, on the subject noted above, and to state that in sub-rule (2) of Rule 10 of the Bombay District Village Development Fund Rules, 1960, the reference is to 'members of the Panchayat' which means the total number of members? The resolution asking for loan will have, therefore, to be passed by a majority of two-thirds of the total number of members, and not by majority of two-thirds of the members present and voting.
