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State Government servants reverting to civil employment without completing military training.
Regularising period of absence from duty.

READ:- Government of India, Ministry of Defence, Office Memorandum No.73039/MT-11/343-B/D(GS-II), dated the 21st February 1966.

"The undersigned is directed to state that the procedure embodied in the succeeding paragraphs will be followed for the regularisation of the period of absence from duty of civilian employees of the Central and State Governments who opted for the grant of Emergency Commission but were reverted back to their parent departments without completing the training. This covers the cases of those who were holding liens on their civil appointments and were sent home as a result of their voluntary resignations or after their withdrawal from the Indian Military Academy, DEHRA DUN, the Officers' Training Schools at Poona and Madras and other pre-commission training establishments had been approved by the Government.

2. Leave with full or average pay, as the case may be, to the extent admissible in their civil posts will be granted by their parent departments for the period of their absence viz from the date of their departure from the training establishment concerned to the date of their reporting back to the civil department concerned.

3. In cases where the period of absence given in Paragraph 2 above is not fully covered by the leave due, the same or the balance of the period, as applicable will be treated as special leave with full pay and allowances to be paid from the Defence Services Estimates.

4. These orders will have effect from 14th January 1963 and will cover cases arising upto and for 26th November, 1965 only.

5. This Office Memorandum issues with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance(Defence)vide their unofficial No.64-S/PA of 1966."

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RESOLUTION:- Government is pleased to direct that the procedure laid down by the Government of India in their Office Memorandum referred to in the preamble to this Resolution should be made applicable to the State Government servants who had opted for grant of Emergency Commission, but who reverted to their civil posts without completing the training.

2. The past cases, if any, should be reviewed and settled according to the procedure prescribed by the Government of India.

3. This Resolution issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its unofficial reference No.3402/769-66/X, dated the 1st April 1966.
